

## **Epicoccum** (Epicoccum nigrum)

Epicoccum nigrum is a saprophytic (lives on dead or decaying organic matter) mold that has world-wide distribution. Outdoors, it can be found in the soil, on canvas and cotton, and on any decaying vegetation. Indoors, Epicoccum has been isolated from carpets, wood flooring, mattress dust and even exposed acrylic paint.

Epicoccum is frequently reported in air samplings. Studies have found 20 – 30% of atopic (having a predisposition to have allergies) patients had a positive test result to Epicoccum. Numerous allergenic proteins have been identified from Epicoccum.

Like most molds, Epicoccum does best in warmer, damp environments. While the spores are frequently found in home air sampling, steps can be taken to minimize exposure to indoor molds.
